## **BEHAVIOUR CODE**

At St Francis College, we promote a healthy school culture which values partnerships, respect and cooperation among staff, students and the wider community. We celebrate diversity in culture, gender, race and ability. Our focus is a Positive Behaviour for Learning (PB4L) programme. The **values and principles** of PB4L are underpinned by the following beliefs:
